


Community Benefit Fund

All successful Renewable Electricity Support Scheme (RESS) projects are required to set up a Community Benefit Fund that focuses on sharing the economic benefits of a wind farm with the local community.

The proposed Carrownagowan Wind Farm will bring a sizable Community Benefit Fund to the local area (see graphic below). The Fund also puts the local community at the heart of decision-making with a committee made up of local people. The committee will decide where to invest the funds which will support local initiatives and infrastructure, based on the Government's Rulebook for Community Benefit Funds under the Renewable Electricity Support Scheme (RESS), which is available to download on the project website.

Construction and the community

We understand that while many in the community are supportive of the wind farm and the benefits it can bring, we also recognise that some residents have concerns. We want to assure everyone that the project team is committed to working constructively and respectfully with the entire community throughout the construction phase.

As with any infrastructure project, there will be some disruption — particularly to local traffic — during construction. We're taking this seriously and will work closely with Clare County Council's Roads Department to carefully manage traffic flow and minimise inconvenience wherever possible. Our plan is to provide notice to the communities in advance of any potential traffic disruption via our CLOs and leaflet drops to residents' homes and businesses.
